You can find heaps of different varieties of food from all over the world, another reason we decided to go to Thailand was our love for Pad Thai. Since we are real foodies, I started to document all the tasty and the best value for money places to eat. Here goes my list for all my favourite places to eat, hope you get to experience these places as much as we did!

Rimping Supermarket



2 - Eggs

2 - Toast

1 - Cup coffee

1 - Glass of orange juice

With jam/butter and a piece of ham

Cost - 59 Baht/1.80USD

This place offers a range of food at affordable prices! They have a good selection of other breakfast stuff which you can order off the menu. When you are there try the Egg Benedict with spinach. It makes your day each and every time you walk

into this cafe and you are guaranteed to be greeted with a huge smile! The breakfast starts from 6am to 10am, use the side entrance as the mall doesn't open till 11am

Ladder Café



2 - Scrambled eggs

2 - Pieces of home baked ciabatta bread.

Side of freshly cut tomatoes and Anchor butter

Cost - 100 Baht/3USD

If you don't feel like a proper breakfast, then order the French toast with boysenberries it is absolutely delicious. Weekends are not a good time to go as they are very busy, try to go there during the weekdays. Keep in mind they are closed on Tuesday & Wednesdays. Opening hours are 8:30am to 3pm so don't miss out!

The Dukes



1 - Gourmet homemade burger

1 - Chips or onion rings

1 - Soft drink

Cost 300 Baht/10USD

If you are tired of noodles and rice, you should make your way to The Dukes restaurant. They have the best burger selection in town, this place offers a huge menu with true American style food. Here is a list of some of the items from their menu, woodfire pizza, juicy Australian beef, seafood, hot dogs and much more. Be sure to get there before 11pm as they do close at 11:30pm

The Best Pad Thai



1 - Pad Thai

Cost - 114 Baht/3.50USD

You will find Pad Thai with or without noodles everywhere in Chiang Mai, but the best Pad Thai is to be had just before you leave at the airport.

Black Canyon Coffee is on the 2nd floor and is a great way to leave the city with an awesome taste in your mouth.

Falafel BTC International restaurant



1 - Falafel Pita

1 - Fruit shake (try the mango)

Cost - 100 Baht/3USD

They have the advertisement on the fence before you enter the restaurant, this deal is not on their menu so ask for a falafel combo with the fruit shake. This restaurant is on the intersection of the night bazaar and the sushi restaurant.

Jok Sompert Chinese restaurant



2 - Chicken Jok

1 - Chicken leg with noodles or rice

Cost 135 Baht/4USD

If you like authentic Chinese food as much as we do, then this is the place to be! Jok is Chinese porridge made from rice and you can add any kind of meat. You can find dim sums and all sorts of noodle dishes starting from 30 Baht/1USD. If you are looking for a midnight snack you can stop by this restaurant as it is open 24/7

Salsa Kitchen



1 - Giant burrito with slow braised red chill beef served with crispy tortilla chips, tomato salsa and sour cream

Cost - 199 Baht/6USD

Salsa kitchen is a true taste of Mexico! They have a choice of combination platters so you can try bit of everything. While you are there, I highly recommend the frozen margaritas. Go for the 1 litre pitcher for 359 Baht/11USD as its great value for money.

Japanese cuisine



1 - Teriyaki chicken and rice

1 - Egg

Cost - 60 Baht/USD1.90

You can find a great deal of food on the 1st floor of Maya mall, lot's of healthy choices to choose from the food hall. Here is a quick tip, place an order and make your way to Rimpping supermarket to buy a soda as it is half the price of the food court.
